

News

Operations & Signalling Subcommittee

The Operations and Signalling Subcommittee has been meeting once a month since April. It has been discussing, and starting to document, updated operational rules and guidelines for the operation of our portable and fixed tracks. The work has already seen good progress with the new level crossing gates for the ground level track, the use of paper tickets for public events and several other improvements in the way we operate when public running.

This work is to review our compliance to the HSE document "HS2020 - Managing health and safety at passenger-carrying miniature railways", and where we feel necessary improve our control measures to manage the risks when public running. Whilst we can implement some of the changes quickly, some things take longer and we are planning for full compliance to our updated Safe Operating Procedures to be for the 2024 season. One significant change for us will be documented competence for Duty Manager, Driver and Guard. Drivers on public running days will need to have been assessed and gain accreditation for driving the appropriate class of locomotive. There will be two classes, Steam and Battery Electric. Someone who has been accredited for Steam will also be accredited for battery electric, petrol and diesel fuelled locomotives.

We are keen to have as many accredited drivers as we can for next season, especially those people who don't own a passenger hauling locomotive. Now that our Polly locomotive is finished and certificated this gives more opportunity for members to gain knowledge, experience and mentorship driving a steam locomotive. We

currently also have an AME Vulcan 4 on loan to the club, for members to gain experience driving Battery Electrics.

The club has started to provide some structured training, and follow up coaching, for both new and experienced drivers. The first was held on Sunday 27th August and it received some very positive feedback. We will be holding some more training days over the coming months.

Another improvement is the standardisation of couplings across the club. We have also documented what was usually good practice for public running and made that mandatory for next season. Issue 1 of our Train Coupling Methods document is accompanying this newsletter.

Club Battery Electric Locomotive

The club has now sold the Class 20 battery electric. The decision was made to sell it while it's still in good condition and upgrade to a new battery electric now, rather than running the Class 20 until it was worn out. Following discussions with various members and committee members, the decision has been made to buy an AME Neptune 4. This is similar to the Vulcan 4 that we have on loan which has proven to be a powerful and smooth locomotive. We have chosen BR Blue, similar to the one shown in the picture. This should be ready for collection during October 2023.
